



The following slides provide instructions for creating an iECHO account. Once your account is set up, you will be able to:

- Access all ECHO Projects that you have registered to join!
- Access all content for your specific ECHO Projects

 - \circ Recordings
 - o Supplemental Materials

iECHO will send an email reminder with a direct Zoom link 30 minutes before your session starts.

Please note that the only way to set up an account is via email, the phone number method is not available in the United States





 Check your email for an invitation email from (ECHO Program Name - <u>no-reply@iecho.org</u>) and click "Join Program"

*If you did not receive the email invite, try checking your spam folder. If you cannot find the invite and/or access the iECHO website, please contact echo@cancer.org.

- 5) Create a secure password that will be easy for you to remember (but hard for an attacker to guess)

Your password must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ At least 10 characters
- ✓ At least one upper-case character (Capital letter e.g. A, B, C, --, Z)
- ✓ At least one numeric character (Numbers e.g., 1,2,3,4, --, 0)
