










No Health Coverage, BRFSS, 2021












New Mexico - CRC Screening



NMRHA Listening Tour

- Stakeholder interviews during the Fall of 2023
 - NM Region
 - 38.7% Southwest
 - 21.3% Metro area
 - 20.0% Northeast
 - 18.7% Northwest
 - 13.3% Southeast
 - Sector
 - 20.0% healthcare
 - 29.3% community-based non-profit
 - 30.7% other (universities, extension offices, tribal organizations, school districts)
